- 2 Education and Opportunity**
Brighten the opportunities for our locals and encourage life-long learning
- 3 Enhancing Livelihoods**
Create access to a diverse range of support and services and improve the lives of our people.



In addition, applications will need to:

- Deliver a project or involve the local community.
- Be a not for profit group or community project.
- Involve the broader community where possible.
- Develop community capacity and capability.
- Align with the focus areas listed within this document.

Whilst we are open to all community groups applying, we will not provide community investment support to organisations that are:

- For profit, without clear community connection.
- Discriminating on the basis of race, gender, ethnicity or lifestyle.
- Based around religious or political activities.
- Involved in advocacy or lobbying.
- Projects or programs that would ordinarily be fully funded by any level of Government.
